# The Mission

Since our beginning in 1970, the Mission has been providing food to hungry every day, providing shelter to the homeless, and providing addiction, recovery and back to work programs for those who have lost their way.

In 2023, the Mission provided assistance to thousands of people who were homeless.

- We served 280,660 meals
- We provided 57,289 nights of shelter
- We gave 4,568 people clothing and basic needs items
- We placed 94 women, 58 men, and 20 families into permanent housing

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Continue to offer our services and make them more accessible to those in need.



## Increase Services

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Our plans to increase our capacity will add another 118 beds. Upon completion there will be 412 beds available.

## Provide food, shelter and case management

We start with the basics by getting people off the streets providing them with a place to stay, nourishing food, and case management to get them back on the path to success.

## Offer services to those in recovery

Many struggle with addiction. We help them learn transformative skills empowering them to become sober, independent, and productive people.

## Move more people into housing

It is not enough to simply shelter a person. We take the next step and help them move into permanent, affordable housing that they are no longer homeless.

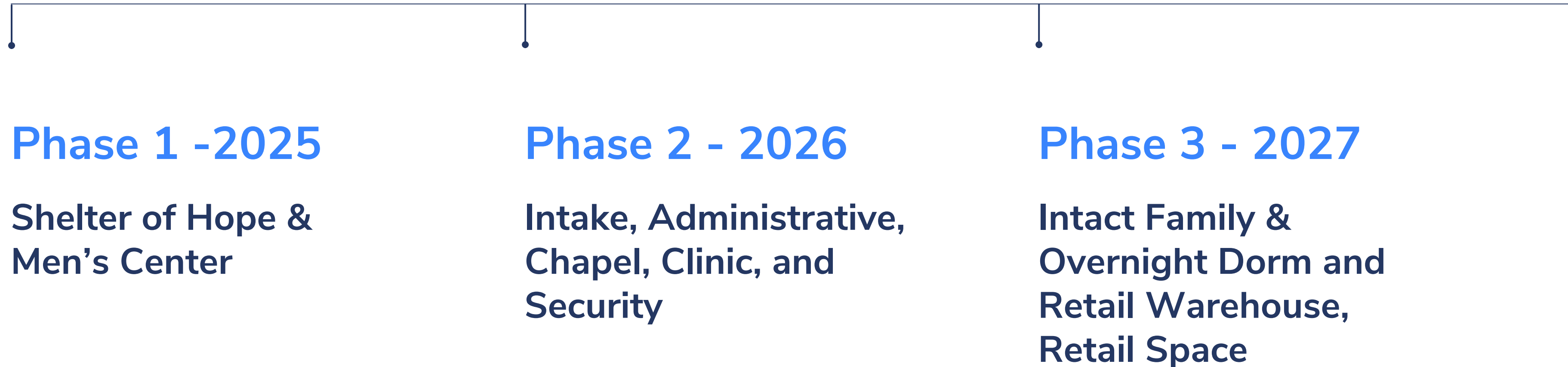

# Service Delivery Plan

We envision a place that provides a warm welcome to those seeking refuge from the harsh streets of Las Vegas.

This journey begins at the Rescue Mission's intake and administrative building. When they enter, they are greeted by friendly staff who will address their immediate needs and begin to take them in for shelter. Due to the complex nature of a clients' needs, they may often spend several hours with staff during the intake process. The new building will offer more space for our program staff, community gatherings and place to meet with clients.
